





Drug Abuse Screening Test 10 (DAST-10): description, strengths and knowledge gaps¹⁰

Purpose

The Drug Abuse Screening Test – ten item (DAST-10) screens for drug-related problems, excluding alcohol.^[2]

Drug(s) of Concern

• Any drug except alcohol

Time-frame(s) of Interest

• Recent (last 12 months)

Populations Tested

- Males & females^[2,3]
- Young people^[4]
- Mental health conditions^[3]

Settings Tested

- AOD specialist services^[2]
- General hospital^[5]
- Emergency departments^[3]
- Psychiatric^[3, 6]



Diagnostics

Utility:

 \checkmark Brief, easy to administer and $\text{score}^{\scriptscriptstyle[7]}$

Psychometric properties:

- Moderate to high levels of:
 - Test-retest and internal reliability
 - Validity, sensitivity and specificity^[4]

Scoring & interpretation:	The DAST-10 comprises ten questions. All ten questions are scored 'yes' or 'no'.			
	Score I point for each question answered "Yes," except for question 3 for which a "No" receives I point. A total score is calculated by summing the points obtained for each DAST-10 question. The minimum total score possible is 0, and the maximum total score possible is 10 (i.e. total score range: 0-10).			
	DAST-10 score interpretation ^[4]			
	Score	Interpretation		
	0	No problems		
	1-2	Low level of problems		
	3-5	Likely to meet DSM criteria		
	6 9	'Cubatantial' dependence		

0	No problems
1-2	Low level of problems
3-5	Likely to meet DSM criteria
6-8	'Substantial' dependence
9-10	'Severe' dependence

Knowledge Gaps

The DAST-10 is a modified version of the DAST-20. The DAST-10 became available in 1982.^[2] How well the DAST-10 accords with DSM-5 criteria is uncertain.

Within an Australian context, few studies have examined DAST-10 content and construct validity or tool acceptance by administrators and raters.
