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Scoring and interpretation: The COWS assesses 11 opioid withdrawal symptoms. Each symptom is scored differently:

- Resting pulse rate (0,1,2 or 4)
- Sweating (0,1,2,3 or 4)
- Restlessness (0,1,3 or 5)
- Pupil size (0,1,2, or 5)
- Bone or joint aches (0,1,2 or 4)
- Runny nose or tearing (0,1,2, or 4)
- GI upset (0,1,2,3 or 5)
- Tremor (0,1,2 or 4)
- Yawning (0,1,2 or 4)
- Anxiety or irritability (0,1,2 or 4)
- Gooseflesh (0,3 or 5).

A total score is calculated by summing the responses to all 11 items. The minimum total score possible is 0, and the maximum total score possible is 48 (i.e. total score range: 0-48).

Score	Interpretation
5-12	Mild withdrawal
13-24	Moderate withdrawal
25-36	Severe withdrawal
37 or more	Very severe withdrawal
